ECRR 2nd Edition
explains why it
is important for children to
get ready to read *before*
they start school.



Children who start kindergarten with
good pre-reading skills have an
advantage.

They are ready to learn to read.



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Narrative Skills
Being able to describe things and events and tell stories.

Print Motivation
Being interested in and enjoying books.

Vocabulary
Knowing the name of things.

Print Awareness
Noticing print, knowing how to handle a book and knowing how to follow the words on a page.

Phonological Awareness
Being able to hear and play with the smaller sounds in words.

Letter Knowledge
Knowing letters are different from each other, knowing their names and sounds and recognizing letters everywhere.

children need to:

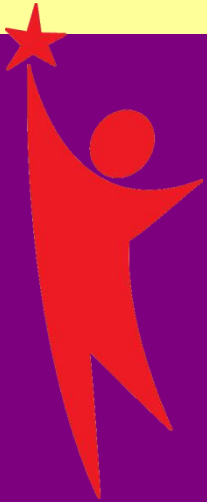
- Learn a code

- Knowing what words mean
- Understanding the meaning of printed language

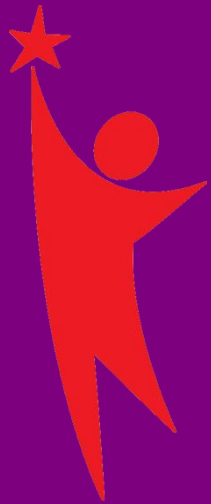

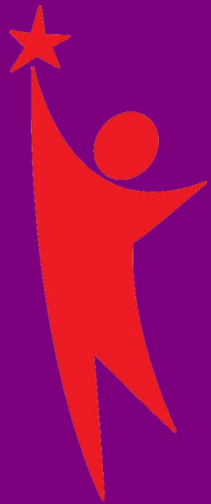
