






Children who start kindergarten with good pre-reading skills have an advantage.

They are ready to learn to read.





To become successful readers, children need to:

- Learn a code
- Understand its meaning

good readers, children
need to make sense
of (comprehend)
what they read.



What is comprehension?

- Knowing what words mean
- Understanding the meaning of printed language





ECRR 2nd Edition explains that reading is more than decoding words.

Good readers understand the meaning of what they read.



Reading is being able to decode the sounds and understand the meaning.
