





SCSL Podcasting Guidelines

The purpose of this document is to establish appropriate procedures and guidelines for delivering quality and meaningful podcasts to a worldwide audience via resources supported by the South Carolina State Library (SCSL). The guidelines and policies outlined in this document are valid for all podcasts that are produced as communication for/from the SCSL.

Rationale

Podcasting allows the SCSL to design and deliver projects that promote libraries, authors, storytellers, and other library-related programs.

Policy Statement

Unless otherwise specified in this policy or other policies, use of podcasting resources at SCSL is restricted to the purpose of the library's mission. The SCSL podcasting resources cannot be used in a manner that violates the law, for political campaigning, personal gain, or activities that are not approved by the library.

Storage

All final podcasts are stored on Podbean.com. The SCSL pays an annual fee to subscribe to this podcasting service, which is paid for using the Communications department budget.

Archiving

The Communications Director maintains an archive or backup of all files that were recorded and/or edited and posted to Podbean.com on a shared drive on the main network.

Recording a Podcast

All SCSL podcasts must meet the standards outlined below. Podcasts should be recorded in the SCSL podcasting studio located on the basement level. The room is to remain locked when not in use. When a recording is in session, a sign should be placed on the door and staff should refrain from knocking or otherwise attempting to interrupt the session. Recording sessions should only be interrupted in the event of an emergency. Primary SCSL staff members hosting the podcast are the Communications Director and the User Experience Designer. Additional staff members may be asked to assist with interviews on an as needed basis.

Tagging

It is important that all podcasts are tagged appropriately, which identifies the primary content for metadata that is used in categorizing SCSL podcasts. The default category is set to South Carolina for all podcasts. None of them should be marked "Uncategorized."

Artwork and Website

All SCSL podcasts will be embedded on the website with artwork that has been approved by the library's User Experience Designer. The website design and structure will also be maintained and be given final approval by the User Experience Designer.

Podcast Pages

All podcasts will have their respective episode number in their title, and information on each page will be in Arial 12pt font. Additionally, each podcast episode will provide up to five links to additional information specifically related to the episode's content. The "LINKS" heading will be in capital letters with the information listed below it—description and hyperlink separated by a colon.

Podcasting Process

- Select topic
- Coordinate day and time with guest
- Book podcasting studio
- Get bio and info for script
- Write script (next slide)
- Ensure that it's a casual conversation
- HIT RECORD AND MAKE SURE MICS ARE ON! ©
- Production (Audacity)
- Post and share and promote

Kathryn is an award-winning author/illustrator, best known for her character-building number/color book series: *One, Zero*, and *Two*. As podcasts have further embedded themselves into popular culture, public libraries have become active producers of podcast content, through both workshops for patrons and library-hosted programs. At their base level, podcasts are an effective way of archiving library programs and making them accessible to patrons who are unable to attend. Yet many public libraries are pushing beyond merely recording author talks by producing shows that supplement existing programs, reflect the communities they serve, and engage patrons in a unique way. The following is just a sample of the many innovative ways public libraries employ podcasts.

In The Librarian Is In, a podcast from the New York Public Library (NYPL), hosts Gwen Glazer (recommendation librarian at NYPL) and Frank Collerius (manager of Jefferson Market Library) oversee a free-ranging and passionate discussion about what they're reading, current events, the library world, and




