- **Apple Notes** – scan documents to pdf, quick notes, checklists, images, handwritten notes, sync to your devices (iOS)
- **Calm!** – mindfulness app for sleep, meditation & relaxation (iOS and Android)
- **CamScanner** – scan docs to email, fax, print or save (iOS and Android)
- **Canva** – design app for logos, cads, invitations, posters, signs, etc. (iOS and Android)
- **Castbox** – podcast player for podcasts (iOS and Android)
- **Duckduckgo** – an internet search engine that emphasized protecting searchers' privacy
- **Evernote** – powerful tool for taking notes (iOS and Android)
- **Evernote Scannable** - integrates with Evernote so that your scans will be synced with your Evernote account (iOS and Android)
- **Genius Scan** – basically a scanner in your pocket (iOS and Android)
- **GoodReads** – world's largest site for readers and book recommendations, you can see what your friends are reading, keep track of what you read and has a barcode scanner to add books into your "to read" list (iOS and Android)
- **Google Keep** – capture, edit, share & collaborate on your notes on any device, anywhere and also set reminders (iOS and Android)
- **Google Maps** – real time navigation, traffic and transit information, also latest information on businesses (hours, location, phone) (iOS and Android)
- **Google Slides** – create, edit and collaborate presentations; present presentations from your device; live closed captioning available (iOS and Android)
- **Google Voice** – a voicemail service from Google (iOS and Android)
- **iScan** – document and PDF scanner for Apple devices (iOS)
- **LastPass** – password manager that stores your passwords (iOS and Android)
- **LibraryThing** – members can catalog browse their collections (iOS and Android)
- **Measure/level** – turns your iPhone or iPad into a tape measure and a level (similar apps on Androids)
- **Microsoft OneNote** – take notes, share ideas, organize, and collaborate and syncs across your devices (iOS and Android)
- **Mobile Doc Scanner** – on Google Play for Android devices (Android)
- **MorgueFile** - copyright free photos (web-based)
- **NatureSpace** – immersive, spatially accurate, 3D recordings for relaxation and quieting the mind (iOS and Android)
- **Pocket** – capture content that comes at your all day, curate stories, articles, news from any device (iOS and Android)
- **Polaroid Originals** – turn your digital photos into Polaroid pictures and more (iOS and Android)
- **QR Code readers** – used for displays (one person linked an article for exercises for a "New Year, New You" display)
- **Relax Melodies** – an efficient sleep aid app (iOS and Android)
- **Remind.com** – communication for school, home and everywhere in between; for texting a group of people (web-based)
- **Reminisce Personal Historian** - used for preserving pics and it's made by a former Indiana librarian! (Android)

- **Shazam** – identify any song in seconds (iOS and Android)
