

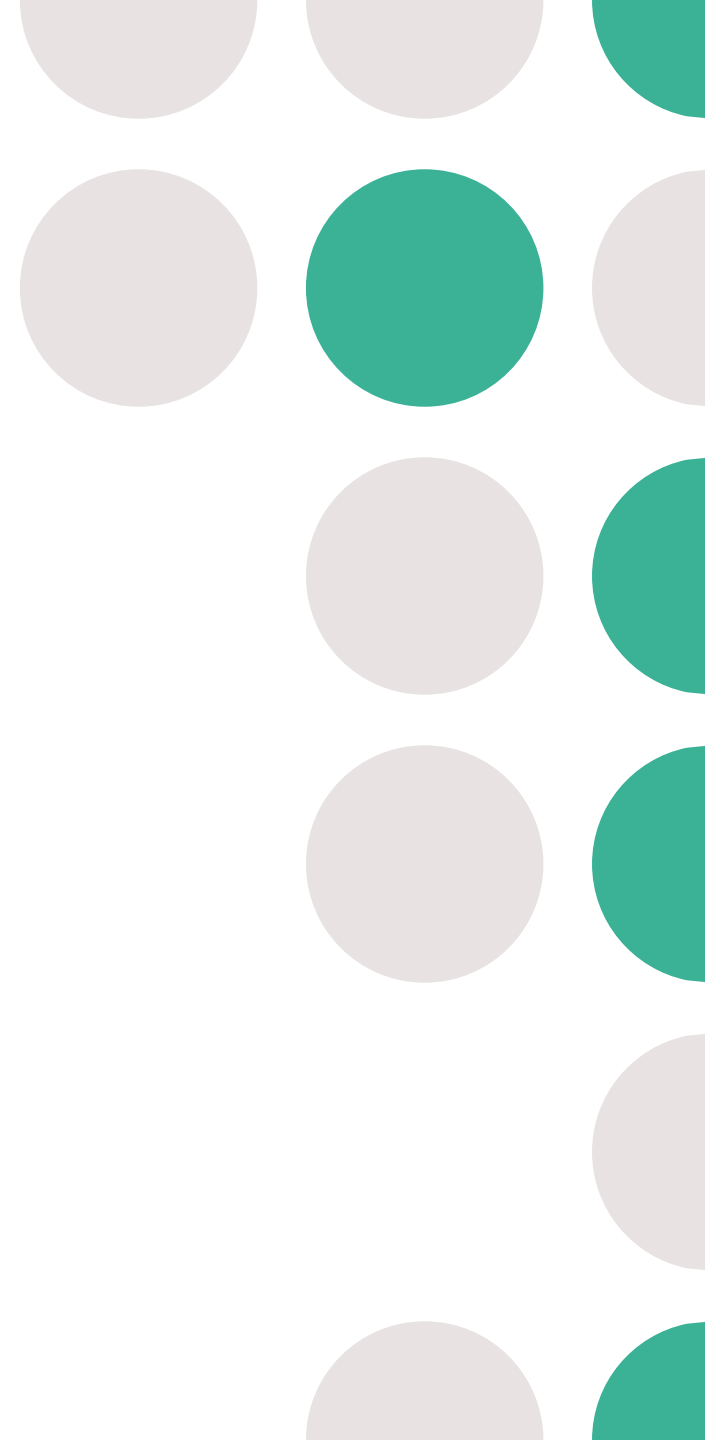

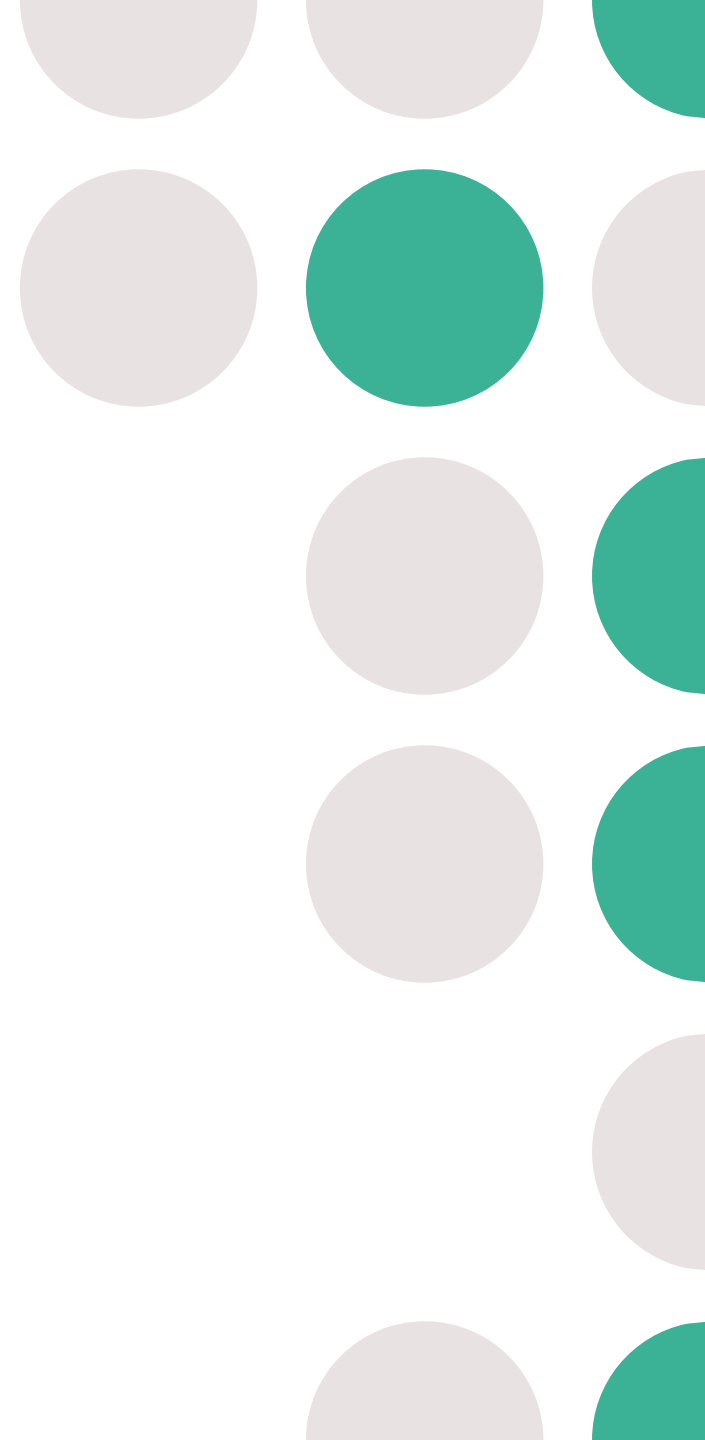

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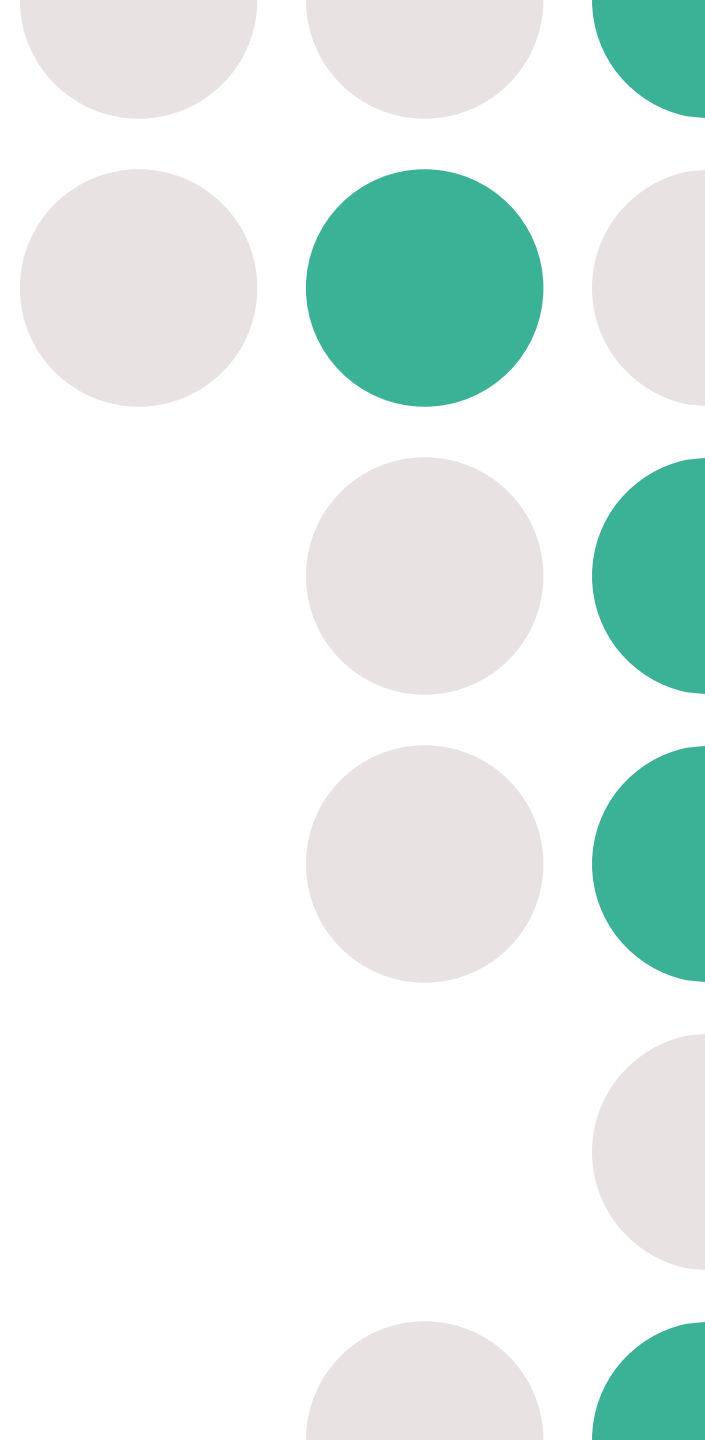
What is free or low-cost programming?

 - On the fly programming
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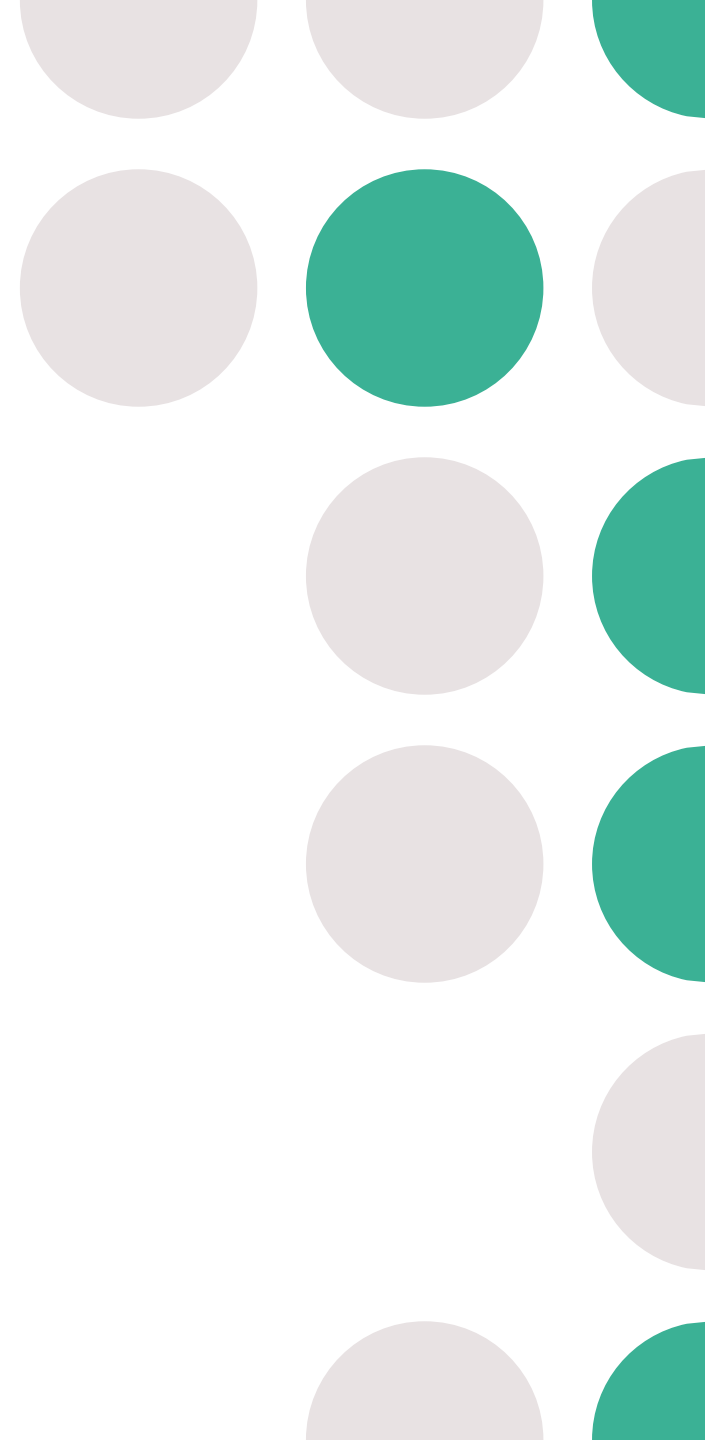
What are some barriers?

 - Resources
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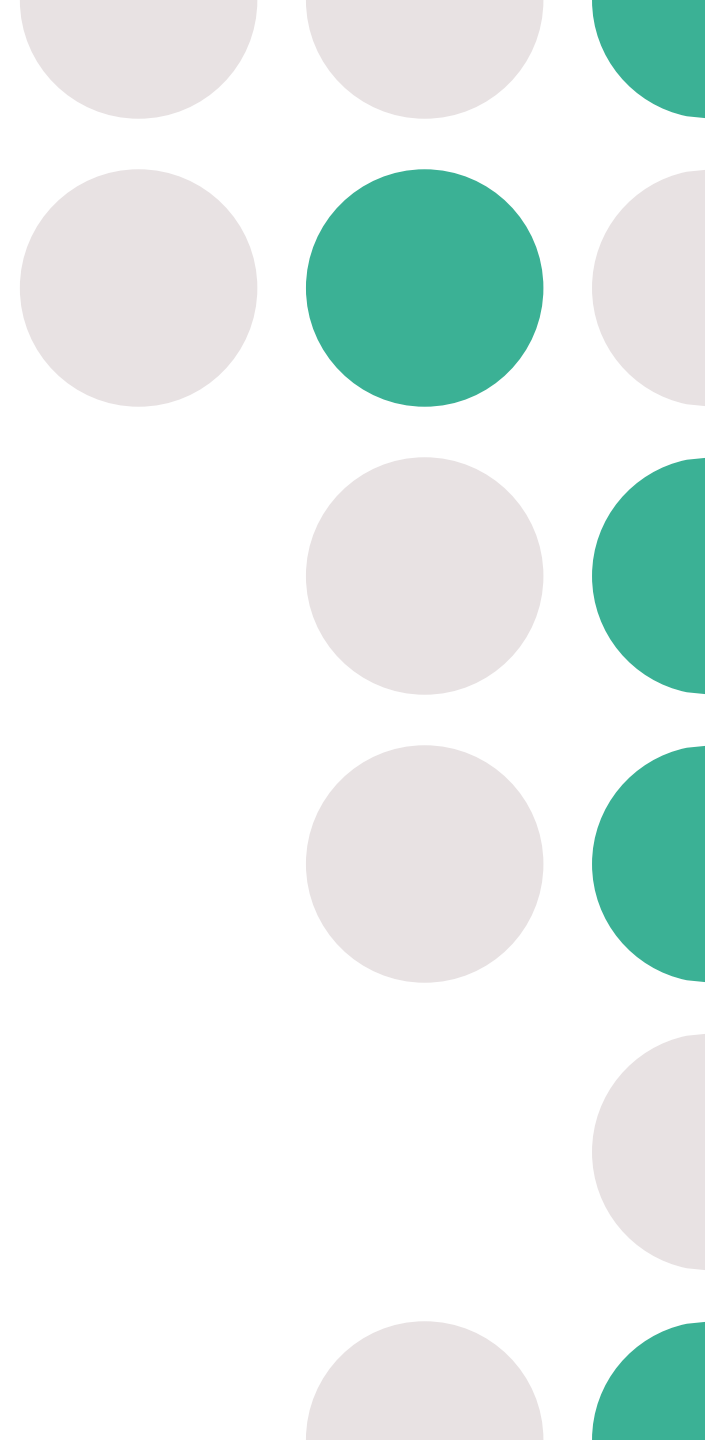
Lets talk about what you already have...

- Cardboard rolls
 - Bottles or bottle caps
 - Pop tabs
 - Paper
 - Cardboard from food boxes
 - Cheerios or fruit loops
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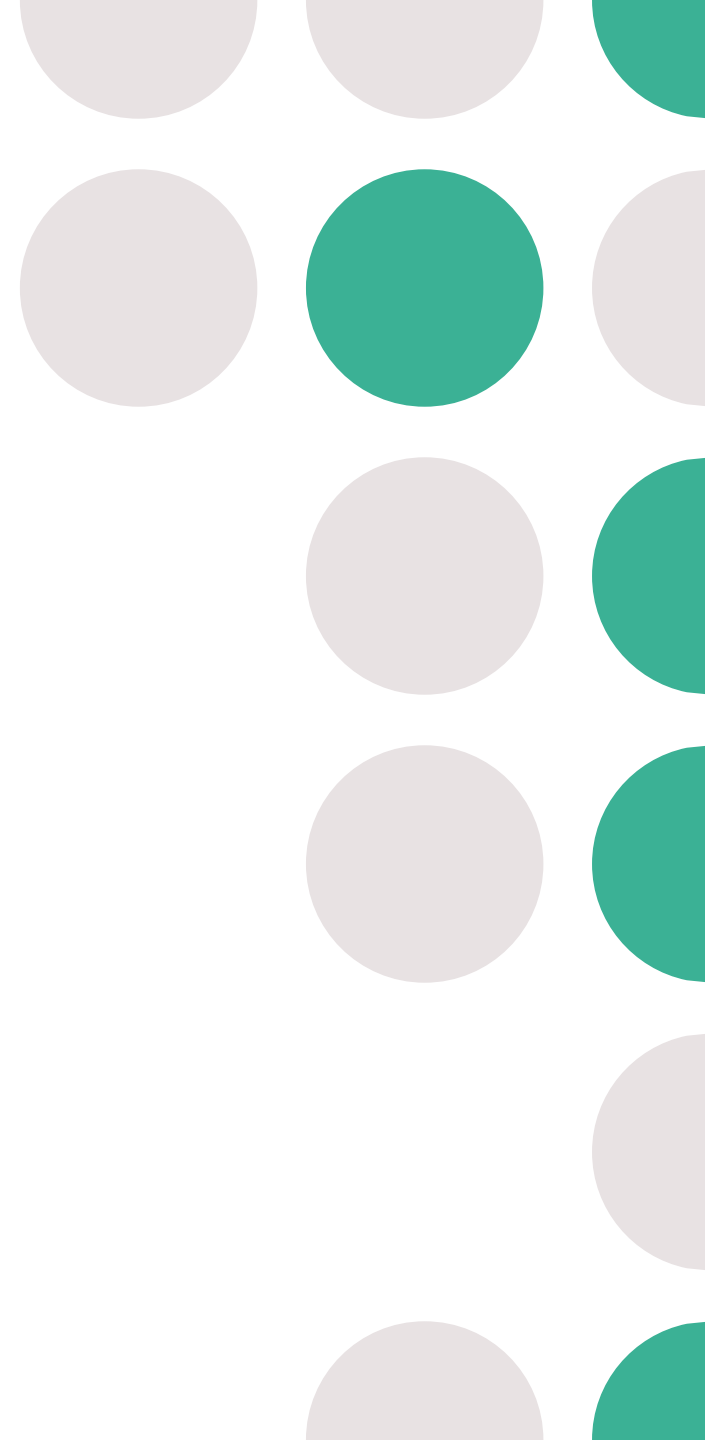
Library supplies

- Construction paper
 - Glue sticks
 - Cardstock
 - Crayons, markers, pencils
 - Books
 - Storytime supplies (scarves, shakers, felt boards)
 - Discarded books
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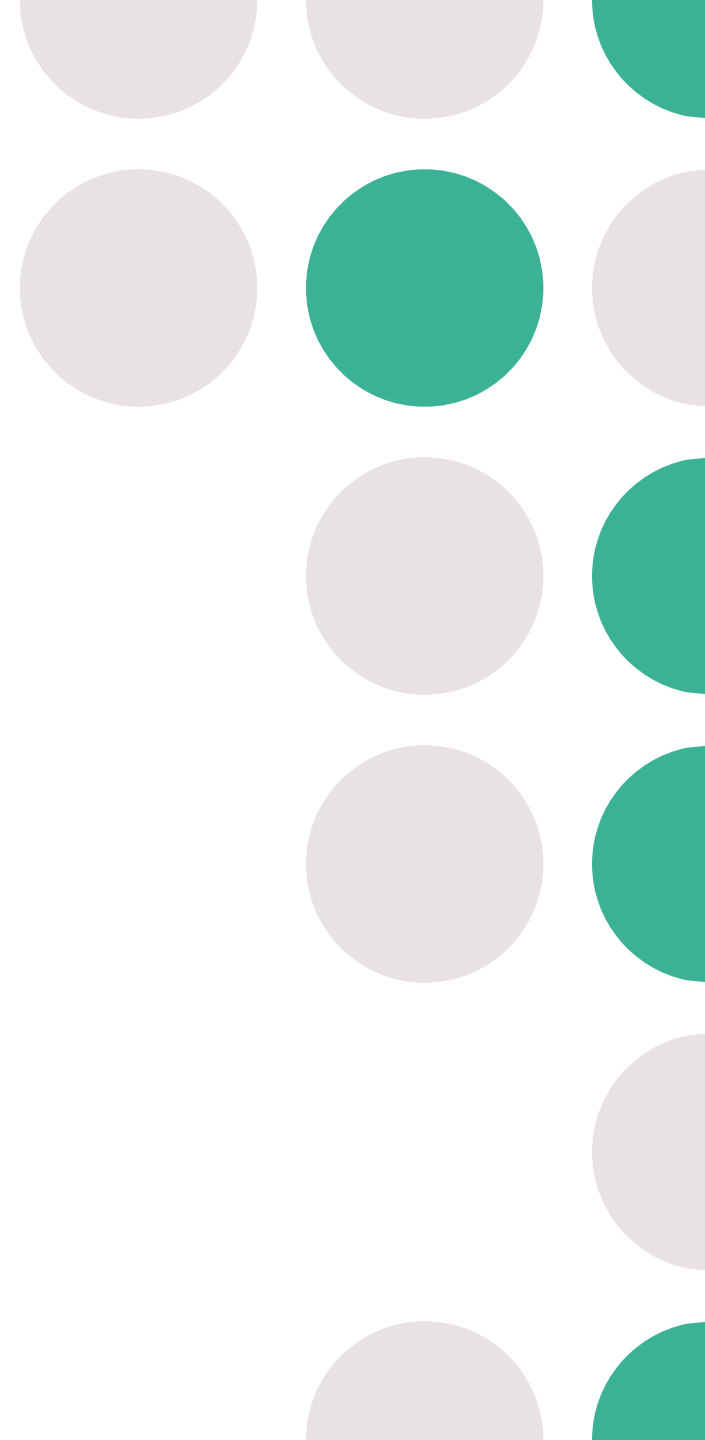
Birth-5

- Impromptu storytime
 - Create take home storytime from left over storytime crafts
 - Bring out props for storytime and encourage play
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Schoolage

- Simple crafts with reused materials
 - Bag up a take home craft or have a table activity
 - STEM challenge sheets for take home
 - Scavenger hunts
 - Have a day for board game donations from the community. Provide the games for use at the library by families.

Basketball tower Challenge

- Use newspapers you have discarded from the collection instead of recycling.
 - Create a tower that can support a basketball.
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Balloon Tower Challenge

- Balloons and masking tape.
 - Use these two materials to create the tallest tower.

Cut cardboard from product boxes you would throw away and just glue on a sheet of paper.

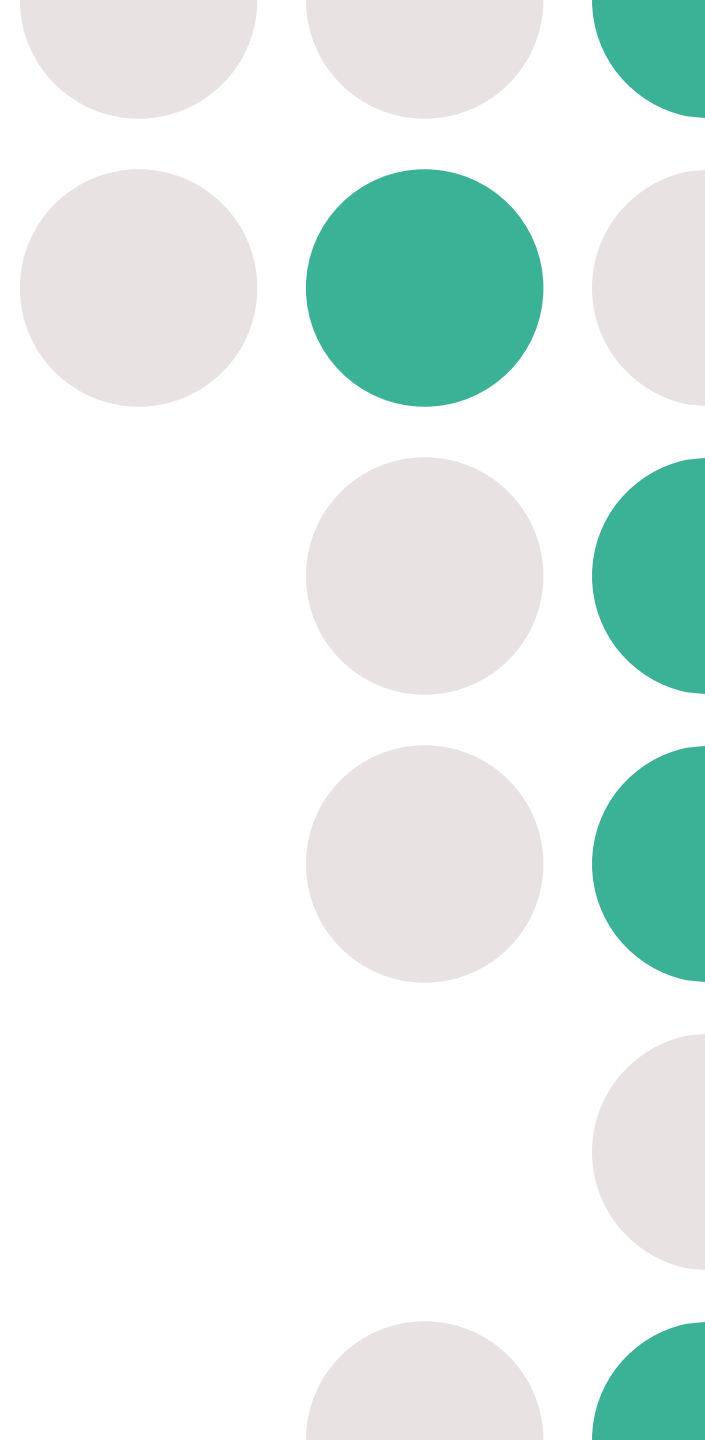
Recycled Robot

Collect lots of materials you would throw away. Lay everything on a table and let the kids craft their own robots.

 - Have Teen advisory Group
 - Post-it art
 - Post-it book suggestions
 - Coloring ornaments to hang up in the room
 - Origami
 - Play board games
 - Recycled book crafts
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Recycled bookmarks

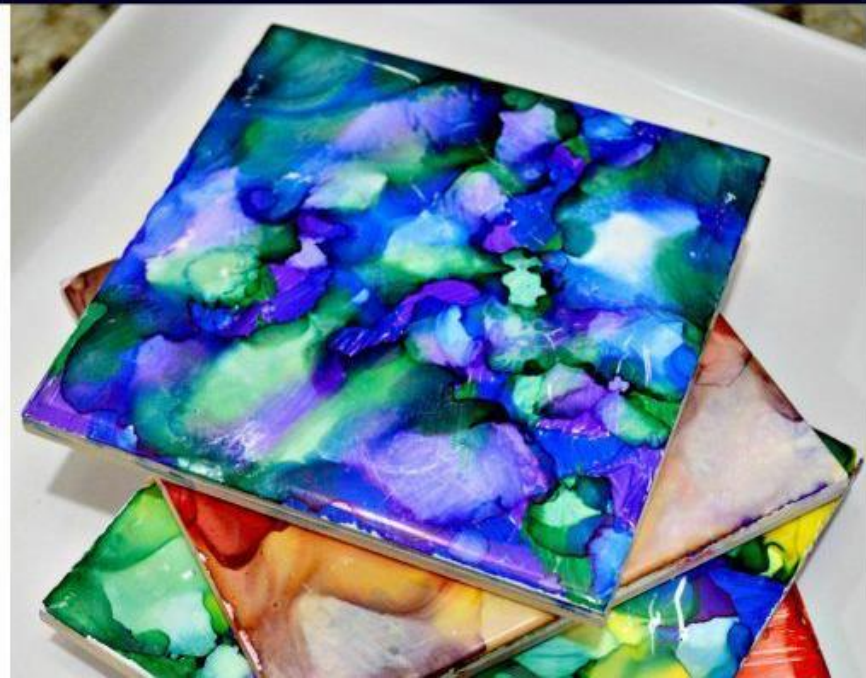
**Save old graphic novels for the

How To Paint with
Sharpies & Alcohol



Sharpie coasters

Buy ceramic tile

**Have teens color with sharpies.
Drop or spray rubbing alcohol.**

Phone Holder

Save cardboard rolls.

Have the teens cut to shape and then color with sharpie.





Building with Cardboard

When you have cardboard from deliveries, cut into 5 x 5 squares with notches in them. On top of a short bookshelf allow the teens to build a sculpture a little everyday.

Wall Sudoku

- Create a template in publisher or excel.
- Print onto paper and assemble.
- Place the remaining numbers needed on sticky notes.





Black out Poetry

Save discarded teen book pages.

Using a sharpie circle words you want to remain for your poem.

Create a drawing or black out the remaining parts of the page.

Book Suggestions

- Allow the teens to reviews books on sticky notes and place them in the inside covers of books.
- Include ALL recommendations, even if they did not like the book.

A collection of 30 colorful, hand-drawn cards or posters displayed on a blue background. The cards are arranged in five rows of six.
