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LEGISLATIVE OVERVIEW


- 2 parts of the General Assembly: House and Senate
- 100 Representatives (serve 2-year terms)
- 50 Senators (serve 4-year terms)
- District maps available at: iga.in.gov/information/
- Odd years = Long Session-Budget year
- Even years = Short Session



LEGISLATIVE OVERVIEW

- Legislative process of the IN General Assembly is complex
- It isn't over until Sine Die

RECENT LEGISLATION

- HEA 1447 (2023) Education Matters, Effective January 1, 2024
 - Requires schools to have challenge policy, catalog available on school website, removes education defense for schools
- HB 1221 (2024) Matters that are obscene or harmful to minors
- SEA 202 (2024) State Educational Matters. Effective July 1, 2024
 - Affects academic librarians-professors must foster an environment of intellectual diversity or face discipline, threatens tenure, threatens academic freedom
- SB 32 (2024) Library funding



ANTICIPATED LEGISLATION

- Senator Tomes: Public Library Funding or Public Library taxing authority
- Harmful materials, public libraries added to HEA 1447
- Property tax reform

- Invite local government officials too
- Did you have a company/organization sponsor or receive a grant? Ask them to come too! OR, ask organizations/businesses to sponsor something for the space.
- Set up areas around the space to highlight resources (i.e. STEM programs)
